

## RMS Titanic Trivia: Questions, Answers, and Facts Printable Trivia Pack

RMS Titanic trivia explores the British passenger liner's maiden voyage, its collision with an iceberg, and the disaster that unfolded in the early hours of 15 April 1912. The ship was sailing from Southampton to New York when it sank, and about 1,500 of the roughly 2,224 people aboard died, cementing Titanic's place in modern historical memory.
