Wolf Hall trivia opens a window onto Hilary Mantel's 2009 historical novel, a Booker Prize winner that traces Thomas Cromwell's rise in the court of Henry VIII. Published by Fourth Estate and named for the Seymour family seat in Wiltshire, the book spans roughly 1500 to 1535 and ends with the death of Sir Thomas More.
